

## **Shelton & Telford Resilience**



Our experience delivering clean water projects is recognised across the country, and was just one of the reasons why we were awarded the Shelton & Telford Resilience contract in 2013.

We were involved in the Shelton & Telford Resilience project from the ECI stage. This early contractor involvement meant we were an integral part of the Programme Development Team. As part of the project we liaised closely with local land owners, securing the access agreements both ourselves and other contractors needed to complete the project to the highest standards and within the agreed timescales. We also advised on various areas of the project, including delivery method and programme targets.

Whilst the construction of the new 7.7 kilometre 600mm diameter ductile iron pipe line was completed by a subcontractor, the project simply could not have gone ahead without our help programming works. Our specially devised programme facilitated continuous pipe laying through three major shafts and tunnels. This pipework phase had to co-ordinate with construction timescales perfectly to prevent delays in overall delivery.





Our programme had to be flexible, particularly during the construction phase where it became apparent engineering difficulties would be experienced. Weekly programme meetings were held with both ourselves and client Enterprise to face and rectify challenges in a timely manner.

Works for the Shelton & Telford Resilience contract were successfully completed in 2014.



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
